## Tiva Wood and Ed Varallo Appointed to Project Steno Board of Directors

The Project Steno board of directors recently added two well-known authorities from the court reporting profession. Tiva has held many leadership positions within NCRA, including chair of the National Court Reporters Foundation (NCRF). She is a Registered Diplomate Reporter (RDR), a Certified Manager of Reporting Services (CMRS), and a Fellow of the Academy of Professional Reporters. "I spent six years on the NCRA board, and during that time the urgent need for our profession to concentrate our collective energies on recruiting the next generation of court reporters became crystal clear," said Wood. "We all have a role to play in that effort, and I'm pleased to join the team that's leading the way."

Ed Varallo is a legend in court reporting, best known as a six-time NCRA National Speed Champion. Ed is an author in the field and a frequent seminar presenter. Indeed, he literally wrote the book on realtime reporting. Ed is a Registered Merit Reporter (RMR) and Certified Realtime Reporter (CRR), and a Fellow of the Academy of Professional Reporters. In 2007, Ed was the recipient of NCRA's highest honor, the Distinguished Service Award. "I went straight from high school into court reporting, and have enjoyed a rewarding 50-year career in the profession," said Varallo. "I still love what I do! Through Project Steno, I want to help open the eyes of today's young people to the wonderful career opportunities court reporting has to offer."
